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TERMS OF SALE

- 1. Terms are strictly CASH to the highest bidder. In case of dispute the decision of the Auctioneer will be final. Lots must be paid for before shipping.
- 2. All bids will be executed by the Auction Manager, but forwarding charges, insurance and registration, etc., will be charged to the buyer. Bids from overseas members should be in Sterling and all postal bids must be received by Friday 14th March 2025 before 1200hrs GMT if by e mail or by Wednesday 12th March 2025 if by phone or mail. Receipt of bids will be acknowledged by e mail or phone so if you don't receive this acknowledgement please contact the Auction Manager asap.
- 3. Successful bidders will be notified of their purchases by Pro-forma invoice (normally by e mail) and lots will be forwarded **after receipt** of the FULL remittance in STERLING funds.
- 4. Lots will normally be sent out by first class mail (or equivalent) for invoices up to £40 in value or by Royal Mail 'Signed For' service (or equivalent) for invoices over £40. Buyers requiring an alternative service should request this when responding to the pro-forma invoice.
- 5. All lots are sold as genuine (except where offered 'as is') but neither the Auctioneer nor the Society can be held responsible for a wrong description by the vendor. Note that your Auction Manager will have made an attempt to verify descriptions but he is not an expertising service!
- 6. All lots are sold in STERLING FUNDS and must be paid for in STERLING FUNDS. Payment may be made either by sterling cheque drawn on a UK clearing bank and made payable to the Society or via PAYPAL or by bank transfer. In the case of PAYPAL payments a surcharge will be applied (normally 5% but may be higher for small invoices) to cover PAYPAL charges. If paying via bank transfer, all bank charges must be paid by the purchaser. Please note that we are no longer able to accept bank drafts drawn on Canadian or US banks.
- 7. The estimates given in the appropriate column are meant as a guide to the current retail value of the lots. In many cases the vendor's figures have been checked and adjusted. It is anticipated that most lots will sell at, or a little above, the estimate given. Condition has been taken into account and every effort made to give a clear description for the benefit of bidders. Such descriptions have, of necessity, to be reasonably brief. The Auction Manager is prepared to attempt to give more detailed descriptions of larger lots and additional scans (e.g. of the back of stamps or covers) can be provided on request. The numbers stated in general lots and accumulations have not all been checked and must be accepted as only approximate.

8. THERE IS NO BUYER'S PREMIUM OR VAT PAYABLE.

9. All but nine of the lots in this sale are illustrated in this catalogue. Large and mixed lots have generally been illustrated by showing a sample of the contents. Lot numbers highlighted in red have illustrations; normally on the adjacent pages. Should these illustrations prove inadequate, the Auction Manager will be happy to provide additional information or scans or provide material for Postal Viewing.

Applications for Postal Viewing will be dealt with in strict rotation. The cost both ways, must be paid for by the viewer and all lots must be sent back **BY RETURN OF POST**, with remittance to cover postage, registration, etc. Unfortunately, no lots can be sent for viewing to overseas members nor can any lots be sent out for postal viewing after Friday 28th February 2025. Scans can be sent as jpeg attachments up to Wednesday 12th March 2025.

All enquiries, viewing requests and bids should be sent to the Auction Manager.

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INFORMATION FOR BIDDERS

An estimate is shown against each lot. This is an estimate of the market value of the lot and may be used as a guide to the likely selling price. However, please note that our Auction Manager does not always get it right!

As this is a club auction, reserves have, in many cases, been set by individual sellers not by the auction manager. As a result, reserve levels can vary a lot from less than 50% to as much as 90% of estimate. In most cases, assume the reserve is around 80% of estimate and **note that bids of less than 70% of estimate are highly unlikely to be successful.**

This sale includes a few lots donated or sold for Society funds. In some cases these will be being sold without reserve but please bid generously in such cases!

Please note that these increments do not allow for bids such as £25 or £35 which always end up being rounded down. We do not accept 'Buy' bids. Bids received which are not in line with the above steps will be rounded down to the nearest bidding increment.

Lots will be sold to the highest bidder at one increment above the next highest bid. Your bid will not be used as a starting price. In the event of tied bids, the bid received earliest will win the lot.

The Auction Manager will treat your bids in confidence. Your limit bid will not be used as a starting bid.

The Postal History sections of the sale contain many specialised items. Rather than split these into too many sub-listings we have attempted to highlight key words (**in red**) that may draw attention to items of special interest or unusual destinations. The system is, of course, not foolproof so if you do have specific interests we would advise close inspection of the lot listings to ensure you do not miss something important to you. Within each section, lots are listed broadly in chronological order.

Please note that although we have made efforts to illustrate the vast majority of lots, the scans are <u>not to scale</u> so relative sizes will not be correct. The scans are, however, of fairly high resolution so you will be able to blow them up in size online to get a close up view of the material. Also note that some of the covers and large stamp lots are held on album pages which can sometimes be hard to scan - so don't be alarmed if some of the scans show edges missing etc. In real life they are all there unless we say they are not!

Oh, and remember if you see something you like....bid early, bid high and bid often!!!

FOREWORD

This sale contains the usual eclectic mix of postal history and stamps from the BNA area. The sale contains lots with estimated values between £1 and £500 with well over 90% of lots being estimated below \pm 50 - very much lotted with the collector in mind. So, even in these times of tight budgets and cost of living crises we hope you can find something to add to your collections that won't break the bank.

As usual, all estimates and bidding are done in £ Sterling although successful overseas bidders will be able to pay invoices in their local currency using PAYPAL or pay via International bank transfer. With your Auction Manager using rather old catalogues for things like Postal Stationery, Revenues and Precancels there are bound to be some big bargains here particularly for our overseas members. Whilst the sale contains a wide variety of BNA material, some of the highlights include:-

1	1875 - 1894 group of 12 Small Queen covers. Frankings from 1 cent to 3 cents with some postmark interest including RPO's , duplex , street cancels etc. Condition varies and a few are rather scruffy but some nice ones as well.	£12
2	1897 - 1904 small group of five advertising covers . One Windsor Hotel cover is reduced at left but otherwise these are very fine and a nice group.	£20
3	1902 to 1906 group of four picture postcards mailed from the UK to Canada and all underpaid with UK 1/2 d stamps accompanied by British hexagonal Tax marks. They have either manuscript or handstamped 2 cents charge marks for postage due. All pre-date the first postage due stamp issue. Fine or better.	£8
4	1902 - 1930 group of four postcards plus one cover all either unpaid or underpaid. Variety of postage due and tax marks and one with PD adhesive. Fine.	£6

No evidence of any postage due being levied. Generally fine or better and unusual.

1929 to 1935 group of three entires all mailed from Bath, England (machine cancels) to Kingston,
Ontario. All are franked with British 1½d stamps. All were undelivered and have a variety of related markings on front and back. All three have a return address of a firm of solicitors in Bath and contain unpresented payable orders on the Dividend account of the Bath Theatre Royal Co. Ltd. The final letter dated in 1935 acknowledges that the addressee is deceased! Minor edge faults from opening but generally fine.

1929 - 1950 trio of covers with mixed Canadian/ US franking comprising:- two US postal stationery envelopes to which Canadian stamps have been added so probably legitimate use in Canada. The third is a letter from Saskatchewan to New York franked with a 1 cent Canadian stamp and a 2 cent US stamp both tied by Canadian machine cancel and appears to have gone through the mails without comment. Interesting group. **DONATED LOT**

1939 to 1945; group of eight airmail covers from Canada to the UK all sent at the prevailing 30 cents rate. Range of frankings all with 10 cent plus 20 cent stamps. All have been written up on display pages. Note a couple with censor tapes. Condition varies a bit but generally fine or better and a nice display group.

1941 - 1963 group of five official government covers comprising:- 1941 Munitions & Supply cover franked with 6 cent airmail (CS type C6) with OHMS perfin, 1951 Dept of Agriculture cover with pair of 2 cent Postes Postage stamps with G overprint, 1951 Dept of Public Works cover with pair of 2 cent Postes Postage stamps with OHMS overprints, 1963 RCMP envelope with 5 cent Wilding with G overprint and 1963 National Revenue Canada window envelope with 2 cent Wilding with G Overprint. Condition varies a bit but mostly fine.

18 1947 - 1949 group of four airmail covers from Canada to the UK all mailed using stamps from the Peace issue. One cover is at the single 15 cents per 1/4 oz rate, the other three are all double rate. Nice range of frankings and all fine to very fine.

1948 - 2009 group of 10 covers all mailed in Newfoundland but with Canadian stamps used post
 Newfie joining the Dominion. Includes a couple of first day covers of the 1949 Newfoundland stamp and also two copies of a 1969 British Schools Exploring Society commemorative cover, otherwise all different. Fine or better.

- 20 1969 (14 Jun) group of five covers commemorating the 50th anniversary of the Alcock & Brown transatlantic flight. Variety of frankings including a FDC and three different covers produced for the 41st Convention of the Royal PS. Very fine.
- 21 Paquebot covers and cancels. Small group of six paquebot covers, three franked with Newfoundland stamps but posted overseas in Halifax N.S., Antwerp and Liverpool respectively. Also three **£10** GB franked covers which were cancelled in Corner Brook, Newfoundland. Lot also includes a few Newfoundland stamps with paquebot cancels. Fine condition.

1911 - 1961 bumper lot of 20 covers all franked with Newfoundland stamps. Includes a couple of
 mixed Canada/ Newfoundland frankings but majority from 1930 - 1948 period. Note some FDC's, airmails etc etc. Should be good value at

1929 - 1947 group of 12 covers all franked with Newfoundland stamps. Includes airmail, FDC's as well as local rates. Good variety of frankings. Condition varies with one or two having minor faults but majority are fine to very fine and should be good value at

- 1843 (1 Feb): cross-border cover (paid) from Montreal to New York. Quadruple-rated at 1/6d Cy to the border and from there at 75ϕ to destination. Pencil annotation on front of cover indicates 24 weight at 1oz, for which the sender paid 5/6d Cy = 1/6d Can + 4/- US, including a rarely seen 2.5% £80 exchange surcharge. Light filing folds but o/w fine. Examples of mail from Canada to the USA showing the exchange surcharge are rare as little mail was prepaid all the way. 1843 (10 Mar): cross-border cover (paid) from Montreal to New York. Triple-rated on the basis £30 of number of enclosed sheets at $1/1\frac{1}{2}$ d Cy to the border and from there at 56¹/₄ cents to destination. 25 Light filing folds but o/w very fine. 1844 (18 Mar): cross-border cover (part-paid) from Montreal to New York. Quadruple-rated £30 26 (1oz) at 1/6d Cy to the border, where the letter was charged 75ϕ for onward journey to destination. Filing folds but generally fine. 1844 (4 Aug): cross-border cover (paid) from Montreal to New York. Single-rated by weight at 27 $4\frac{1}{2}$ d Cy to the border and then double-rated by number of sheets (2) at $37\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ for onward journey to New York. Filing folds but generally fine and nice example of the differing rating methods £30 either side of the border. 1844 (10 Aug): cross-border cover (part-paid) from Montreal to New York. Single-rated by £30 weight at 4¹/₂d Cy to the border and then charged by number of sheets (2) at $37\frac{1}{2}\phi$ for onward 28 journey to New York. Very fine and nice example of the differing rating methods either side of the border. 1844 (16 Nov): cross-border cover (paid) from Quebec to New York. Double-rated at 1/11d Cy to the border and at $37\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ for the onward journey to destination. Quebec crowned-circle hands-29 £30 tamp. Very fine. 1851 (Jan) cover from Montreal to New York with red Montreal tombstone paid cancel accompanied by handstamped red '10' in circle. Also rated 4¹/₂ in red mss for postage to the border. Front £18 30 has signature of J.C. Alexander A.W.C. in lower left corner and endorsed by recipient as 'Sir J. Alexander'. Addressed to Samuel Ruggles. Very fine. 1852 (6 Aug) outer wrapper from Quebec to Montreal rated 3 (black mss) with very fine strike of 31 the Steam Boat Letter Quebec cancel in red. Back has Montreal receipt of 7 August. Very fine. £15 1854 (31 Aug) cover from Montreal to Braintree, Vermont. Red Montreal tombstone cancel 32 accompanied by handstamped red PAID and '10' and mss '6'. Very fine. £12 1855 (7 Aug) sfl from Perth UC to Milford, New York. Endorsed in mss via Kingston and Cape 33 Vincent. Rated 6d in circle and weak strike of 10. Edge faults from opening at top but otherwise £8 fine. 1857 (16 Apr) cover from Dunnville to North Java New York with very fine strike of the PAID 6d 34 in circle handstamp in red. Unusual cross border cover in that it does not show the CANADA cross £5 border marking required by the postal regulations. Fine. 1860 (3 Feb) entire folded letter from Asphodel U.C. (two ring cancel with manuscript date) sent 35 to Portland USA. Front has black PAID handstamp and manuscript 10¢. Backstamped Peterboro £15 3 Feb and Montreal 5 Feb. Central filing fold but otherwise fine. 1860 (27 Mar) large registered letter mailed from Quebec to the Asst. Comm of Crown Lands in 36 Ottawa and rated FREE handstamp in red. Cover is badly creased and with some edge faults but £12
- **37** 1865 (25 Oct) unpaid letter mailed from Quebec to Montreal addressed to Henry Morgan. Rated 7 (black handstamp). Cover has some edge staining but otherwise fine.

Free rated registered letters from the Cents period are rarely seen.
